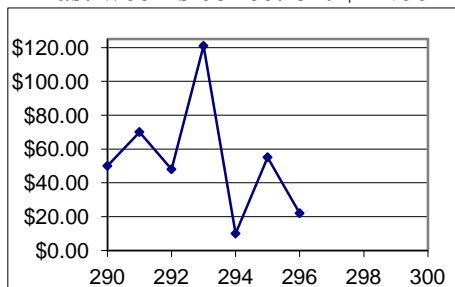

Reflection:

Brokenness and healing are to the fore in today's liturgy. There are very few lives which are not touched by sickness, whether of body, mind or spirit. This has always been so and presumably will continue thus. Jesus is the one who is presented as offering hope to those so affected, a light at the end of the tunnel. Those involved in the alleviation of suffering of whatever kind are carrying out the mission of Jesus in their own generation.

RESPONSES:

Entrance Antiphon:

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

Responsorial Psalm:

Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia!

He bore our sickness, and endured our suffering.

Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon:

Let them thank the Lord for his mercy, his wonders for the children of men, for he satisfies the thirsty soul, and the hungry he fills with good things.

5th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The first reading each Sunday is chosen because of a connection with the Gospel of the day. Sometimes an incident occurring in the Gospel is seen to be foreshadowed by an earlier event in the Hebrew Scriptures. Other times they will both contain a similar theme. However, before rushing to see how the first reading is fulfilled in the Gospel, it is advisable to try to find out what the first reading meant in its own day. A second step can then be to see how both readings enlighten each other.
